Other: - LCol Flint was informed that there was a firefight between Israeli and Jordanian Forces. Upon investigation it was determined that at least two Israeli soldiers had been wounded. LCol Flint, two United Nations Military Observers (UNMOs) and a



party of stretcher-bearers, all unarmed, proceeded under the protection of two white flags to rescue the wounded soldiers. Prior to this, assurances had been given by both sides that the firing would be stopped during the rescue mission. A single shot felled a member of the Israeli patrol and further firing forced the UNMOs and the remainder of the rescue party to the ground. LCol Flint, carrying a white flag, attempted to see where the firing was coming from and was killed instantly by a Jordanian sniper.
